
Student Arrival and Pick up at School

In the interest of student safety, we ask that when you bring your child to school to follow the drop off zone rules.

Please to not park your car in the drop-off lane while you walk your child into the school. The drop off lane is for letting your child out and having them enter the school on their own while you drive away. We have had some traffic backups in the drop-off zone in the last week as parents have had to wait for a place to drop off their children. If you need to accompany your child into the school, please park in the school parking lot or in an appropriate street space. Please refer to the map for details.

As a reminder to families, students who arrive prior to 8:30 are asked to wait outside (doors open and supervision begins at 8:30). Students arriving after 8:45 need to check in at the office to get a late slip before going to class. This helps us account for all students and to ensure that correct attendance information is entered for each child. At the end of the day, primary students will be dismissed through the **outside exit doors of their classroom**.



Early Warning

At Diefenbaker we have an "Early Warning System" for our students. Parents are asked to call the Early Warning line before school starts to report any absences or the late arrival of their child(ren). Please call 604-718-4094, and leave a message with your child's name and division/teacher's name and the reason for absence. You may call this number at any time...in the evening, during the night, or in the early morning. Thank you for your co-operation in ensuring the safety of your child and thank you to our parent volunteers for their help!

Student Lunches

We need your help to make sure that your child comes to school with a lunch. Lunches are often left at home or in the car, and we can't provide more than a small snack to get students through the day. A morning check for lunches makes a difference! Please have a discussion with your child about his or her lunch to make sure there is enough food to last the day. We will keep you informed by email if your child does not bring a lunch.

If your child requires cutlery for his/her lunch, please remember to pack it! We are not able to hand out cutlery to all the students who are asking for it. We suggest getting a set of plastic cutlery to be included in your child's lunch bag each day so that your child is never without what he or she needs.

Outside at Recess and Lunch

Students at Diefenbaker head outside at recess and lunch for fresh air and play even if it's raining (unless it's absolutely pouring). Please make sure that your child has appropriate footwear to go outside on wet days. A pair of boots or outside shoes is helpful, and an extra pair of socks always comes in handy. Students should also have a jacket or coat at school every day (also valuable in case of an emergency if we have to stay at school for an extended period of time) and they may wish to bring an umbrella as well. These items can be stored in your child's locker. Puddles and children just seem to find each other...

Peanut Allergies

All parents need to be aware that there are several children in our school with severe life-threatening food allergies to peanuts and nuts (anaphylaxis). Although this may or may not affect your child's class directly, we want to inform you so that you may choose to send foods with your child to school that are free from peanuts or nut products. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Mrs. Stapleton.

Medical Concerns

If your child has any specific health concerns that we should be aware of please contact the office. If your child has a need to have medication given at school, there is a special form that needs to be filled in by you and your dispensing pharmacist. If your child requires an Epi-pen, please provide the school with a new and current Epi-pen as soon as possible.

Emergency Contact Information, Walking Field Trip Permission and a Use of Personal Information/Responsible Technology Use Forms

Please review, make any changes, sign where applicable and return these forms to your child's teacher as soon as possible. The information provided on these forms is *very important* for the school to have on file. We encourage you to say "Yes" to receiving electronic communications to keep up to date on school life and for your child to be included in the yearly Memory Book.

Fruit and Veggie Program

Diefenbaker School will continue to be part of the B.C. Provincial Gov't Fruit and Veggie Program. Twelve times throughout the 2016-2017 school year the Program will provide the school with enough washed fruit or vegetables for the students and staff to have a healthy snack. This is not meant to replace or substitute the students' regular recess or lunch. The students will be given different fruit or veggies throughout the year. As well this year, all Kindergarten to Grade 5 students will be provided with a 125ml carton of milk (soy or 2% milk).

All students will participate in the program unless parents specifically request that their child not be provided with the foods. Please inform the classroom teacher if your child is not to participate in the



program.
