- -Volunteer needs:

- 2. Fundraising coordinator: We are also looking for someone to help with fundraising and the parents volunteers associated with fundraising activities. Kathleen Stevens volunteers. Thank you Kathleen!

Purdy's order as a fundraiser (December usually): Noela, Smita and Kathleen willing to help.

- -Allergy protocols: medical lists are generated after school is well underway (ie after pink forms returned) Parents are encouraged to contact their childs teacher as soon as possible including temporary classroom placements (ie first week of school). Huey will engage staff in conversation around this at next staff meeting (Monday October 3).
- -Drones on school premises: there have been drones around the school and Huey has spoken to those involved to ask not to use at school.

Rainbow crosswalk: Hermitage crosswalk has recently been updated so it won't be there. Other crosswalk option is on Fortune. Large crosswalk at Minoru/Library was very pricey. PAC and admin will research options for this and propose at future meeting(s).

Community Art Grant: application usually due at beginning of the school year. Alex will ask his wife for input as she worked on the murals at McMath High School.

Fruit and Veggie is back! Starts tomorrow (Thursday September 29). Smita is the coordinator and is looking for volunteers to help to distribute. Future dates are: October 31, December 5, January 23, February 6, February 27, April 3, April 24, May 8th, May 29th

Fundraising goals for 2022-2023:

1. Crosswalk

- 2. Variety Club has a matching grant program. Usually around sensory inclusive equipment such as "Sensory Pathways" Smita has just contacted a Variety representative and they are willing to come to PAC meeting to discuss the program. Angela will put Smita in touch with Variety Club representative that is assisting her school PAC with completing application. Grant application expires October 31
- 3. Veggie bundles possibly more work than Purdys but does have a good return to the school. Kathleen is willing to coordinate this. BC Agricultural in the Classroom and Kathleen will start process. Suggestion to try this for the fall/pre Holiday season INSTEAD of Purdys and move Purdys to the Spring. Kathleen will check on the dates for ordering and delivery.
- 4. Movie night: do we want to bring this back? Maybe worth considering for next year when we have a new sound system. We possibly need a new projector as well.
- 5. Gift cards: the system works as collection of gift cards and then paying the company the charge ie. school keeps remaining. Collect orders by middle of November. Usually a week later company emails to say order is ready for pick up or delivery and then school is responsible for sorting and distributing. Mimi has been recruited to help Huey. Angela willing to help as well.
- 6. Babysitters course: an individual can come to school on November pro d to teach those interested. Huey believes school should be free to use. Timing 8.30 to 3.30. For ages 11-12
