1. It's been a great start-up to school year.

- 2. Seismic Replacement update
- Drilling work will be continuing this week (Stone Columns)
- Vibrations/noise is being monitored and measured for safety. Students may feel vibrations, hear sounds because of the drilling close to the school. Work starts closer to school and will move away.

- Construction (foundation and building) is scheduled to resume in the spring of 2026

3. School Story

- We are focusing on literacy and improving <u>reading comprehension</u> in all our students.
- We have planned a variety of school wide literacy initiatives and celebrations (eg: Assemblies celebrating class goals throughout the year, Reading Goals/Class like as a class reading 250 books). We would also like each class to do a class reward for reading.

Prize: New Book for class, and chips.

Winter Performance: "Stories by the Fire" Assembly

- -Assessment school wide is completed, will follow up end of year.
- We would appreciate your financial support in this new school goal.
- 4. Camp Sasamat -new camp for Diefenbaker. Students were connected and engaged. More information to come regarding next year's location.

5. Garden

- We are wanting to downsize our gardens from 18 wooden, disintegrating garden beds.
- School has purchased 6 metal beds (eco friendly, with weed control). They are transferable to new building. New location TBD (by Gardening committee)
- The cost is \$350 per garden bed, with mulch, to total of \$2300. School has \$1000 in gardening 'fund', asking PAC for \$1300.
- Used current wood/logs to separate new 6 garden beds with a 'digging pit'. Richmond maintenance.
- Outdoor Kitchen will be refurnished
- 6. Fine Arts performances for this year:
- Ilumidance electronic dance performance for the whole school (\$1450)
- Dancers of Damelahamid Indigenous performance (\$1300)
- Uzume Taiko Drumming workshops in May each division will get a hands on workshop (2 days \$1775 per day, total \$3550)

7. District News

- a. The Student and Family Affordability Fund provides funding to school districts to increase food security for students and their families, and to support students, parents, and quardians with affordability concerns.
- b. Feeding Futures Fund will be added for the next three years providing funds for students needing breakfast & lunch at school.
- c. Animals at school policy dogs are not allowed in school buildings (8am-5pm). They can be brought by parents at pick up/drop off times but must be outside, on a leash, and trained. Pets in classrooms-different rules for teachers
